

Modified Senior Project

Presentation

- About You: What is unique about you? What activities are you involved in? What events have you participated in?
- Your Senior Year: What path did you choose (SCF/MTC/FLVS/etc.)? Why did you choose this path?
- What You Learned: What were the most valuable learning experiences for you? Why? What difficulties did you face? How did you overcome obstacles?
- Advice for Others: Would you recommend your path to anyone else? Why or why not? Who specifically would benefit from choosing this path versus a more traditional senior year?
- Conclusion: Please add anything you think would help your audience understand your senior year experience.

The presentation is similar to a job interview. You should be dressed appropriately. For example, young men should wear dress pants, dress shirts and ties. Young ladies should wear business style clothing and shoes. If you are not sure if your clothing is appropriate, please send a picture and ask. The time requirement is 6-8 minutes. You may include video, but you still must present for at least 5 minutes. If you choose to submit a video instead of presenting live, you must appear in the video. You may use a program such as Screencastomatic or have someone take a video of you presenting. Please make sure you share your video using your school OneDrive and title it with your name and modified senior project presentation. It is your responsibility to make sure your video is saved in a viewable format.

Sample Presentation Slides:



1-page Reflection Essay

- Personal Reflection: Describe yourself and your interests.
- Career and Life Goals: What is next for you? How do you plan to achieve these goals?
- Community Experience/Real-World Activities: How did your experience this year affect you or your goals? What was it like attending college/completing training or certification/working/etc.?
- Final Thoughts: What was a significant event or lesson you learned this year? What advice would you give to someone considering this path for senior year?

Essay should be in MLA format (typed, double-spaced) with your name, the date and a title. If you email your reflection, be sure to include your name in the title along with modified senior project reflection.
